Learning Objectives	 Recognise spiritual need. Get involved (through verbal and non-verbal communication, check with the patient/client whether they need some spiritual support. Identify the spiritual needs of the patient. 				
Strategy Description	 Start with the importance and recognition of their spirituality in order to recognise the spirituality of the other. Presenting with different spiritual/existential questions to motivate students to stop for a moment and ask themselves about their spirituality. Use the real-life cases and their narrative stories, that demonstrates how the patient/client spiritual needs have or have not been met. Through the stories (or if it is possible through short video clips) present to students how the embodied human being experience spirituality. 				
Educator's Role	The teacher needs to motivate students why the spiritual care is an essential part of the integrated, holistic care.
